To ensure that we are accessing your child's academic and behavioral needs we would like to make some suggestions. Each night your child should commit to studying his/ her Math and Social Studies notes, ELA, Math and Science vocabulary words for 30-40 minutes (depends on how fast student learns); read 30 minutes a night for the reading log and complete all homework assignments. Science and ELA have vocabulary quizzes weekly. If your child needs any additional help on any of the concepts covered, you can do the following: Remind them to ask questions in class; send a letter or contact the teacher of the subject manner by phone at the school or e-mail and/or stay after school for tutoring. We are more than happy to assist with possible solutions. Your child should come to school prepared with all of his/her materials and books, selfmotivated and ready to learn. Please remind your child to: follow all classroom rules and regulations; respect the rights of others (do not blurt out statements; stay on task; pay attention and ask relevant questions pertaining to the subject manner (big or small, ask them all); and work hard. We will do all that we can to enhance and better your child's academic success, nevertheless, remind your child that education is an individual responsibility.
